





Her new series, ironically titled, "Great Leap Forward", again stridently

focuses on the INJUSTICES AND INHUMANITY

NIRMALA has been at the forefront of Malaysian art since the early 70s and she has consistently used her canvases to highlight man's inhumanity to man and his degradation of the environment. Her new works continue in that vein.

Her new series, GREAT LEAP FORWARD, focuses on the country's fast pace development and the wrenching changes that accompany such development. Mostly in black and white, and sometimes blood red, the new works seamlessly blend screenprinting and dramatic brushstrokes.

In many ways, these are her most beautiful and eloquent works, making them all the more powerful and accessible.

Norma Abbas' last solo exhibition was held in 1995. She took a long hiatus to nurse a personal loss. From such loss has come some of her most personal works, culled from the irreducible memory of a man she loved.

A time of grief is so often also a time for contemplation and renewal. Out of the darkness comes light, and some of her new works pursue the exploration of her roots in the continuing "INDO-CONNECTION" series.

Emerging from the mournful colours of her loss, Norma renews her love of bright colours and texture. Whilst collage is still central to her work, the most recent paintings are more painterly and rely a great deal more on her innate drawing skills.






